



Syllabus for True and Good: Living the Biblical Worldview

Desired Outcome: Participants in this class will be able to clearly articulate the Biblical worldview, why it is true and how it provides the best solutions to the current cultural challenges. They will also understand alternative worldviews and learn how to effectively share the truth and goodness of the Biblical worldview with others.

Who Should Participate: This advanced discipleship course is for all committed Christians interested in more effectively discipling the people they care about to fully understand why God's design for our world is both true and good. This class will help you live faithfully, acquire wisdom, and act courageously.

Cost: \$100 plus the cost of the books (purchased by student)

Monthly meeting date, topic and book (read in prior month):

A two and one half hour meeting each month where the students discuss a book, participate in a lecture with a group discussion and apply what they have learned in a working session.
