- Key verse: 2 Corinthians 3:18
- Behold (verb): "to gaze upon; to see or observe something or someone remarkable"
- Question: What are you beholding?
 - ☐ Behold money, and you become greedy.
 - $\hfill \square$ Behold social media, and you become envious.
 - ☐ Behold your phone, and you become a zombie.
 - Behold pornography, and you become addicted and unsatisfied.Behold the news, and you become mad or scared or depressed.
 - ☐ Behold Jesus, and you become more and more like Jesus.
- Transformation (sanctification) happens by beholding God's glory in Jesus (2 Cor. 4:6). You CAN be transformed!! Never give up on being transformed!!!
- "transformed" = metamorpho = to transform, to change the inward reality to something else; from which we get our word metamorphosis
- Metamorphosis: "a marked and abrupt developmental change in the structure of an animal (as a butterfly or a frog) occurring subsequent to birth."

Four Pictures to Help Us Behold God's Glory and Be

Transformed (2 Corinthians 2:14-3:18)

- Picture = Roman Triumph victory parade
- Think Astros World Series Parade
- Warren Wiersbe: "In Rome, if a commander-in-chief general won a complete victory over the enemy on foreign soil, and if he killed at least 5000 enemy soldiers and gained new territory for the emperor, then that general was entitled to a Roman Triumph. The processional would include the general riding in a golden chariot, surrounded by his officers. The general's sons would walk behind their father's chariot, sharing in his victory. The parade would include a display of the spoils of battle, as well as the captive enemy soldiers. The Roman priests would also be in the parade, carrying burning incense to pay tribute to the victorious army. To the triumphant soldiers, the smell of the incense meant life and victory; but to the conquered enemy, the aroma meant defeat and death. For the procession would end at the Circus Maximus (a stadium that could seat 250,000 people) where the enemy captives would entertain the people by fighting wild beasts and being killed."
- Jesus Christ, our great General Commander in Chief, came to foreign soil (earth) and completely defeated the enemies of sin, death, and the devil. Instead of killing 5000 soldiers, He gave life to 5000 on Pentecost-plus (Acts 2:41; 4:4). We are the sons and daughters of the General through faith in Christ, and we share in His victory. We are co-heirs with Christ (Romans 8:17). The fragrance of the parade is sweet to believers because of our victory in Christ. The fragrance of the parade smells like death to those who refuse Christ.
- Application #1 Three questions to ask myself from this picture:

 □ Am I a son or daughter of Commander in Chief Jesus? Have I placed my faith in Jesus and been adopted into His family? If not, place your faith in Jesus today. Follow Him.
 □ Am I walking in the victory that is mine through Christ? Or am I walking in defeat? (Behold your victory!!)
 □ What kind of aroma am I giving off? Does my life aroma testify to Jesus?
- John 1:12 (NIV) To all who received (Jesus), to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God.
- Matthew 9:9 Jesus saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth, and He said to him, "Follow Me." And (Matthew) rose and followed Jesus.

2. Behold God's Word _____ (2:17)

- Picture = sculpture without wax
- "sincerity" comes from the Latin sine ("without") and cera ("wax");
 to be sincere means to be "without wax" (Roman sculptors).
- A peddler will tell you whatever you want to here so that they can sell you whatever they are trying to sell.
- We are to share God's Word with authenticity and sincerity.
- Jim's moment of freedom: "I don't know. Let's search for answers together. We might not know the answer to that question until we get to Heaven."
- We are transformed when we are honest and stop trying to cover up our flaws or lack of knowledge.


3. Behold your _____ given to you in a new covenant (3:1-6)

- Picture = a letter of recommendation
- Some people in Corinth were demanding letters of recommendation from Paul to prove his credentials and authority – a practice of some itinerant evangelists who were unknown to their audience. For Paul, that was like children asking for letters of recommendation from their parents! Paul birthed the church in Corinth! The believing Corinthians WERE his letters of recommendation!
- The use of the terms "tablets of stone" and "tablets of human hearts" is a reference to the old covenant versus the new covenant. The old covenant law was written on tablets of stone (Exodus 24:12; 31:18), but these laws could not transform lives. They could only show our sinfulness and falling short. We needed a new covenant that would transform us by giving us new hearts.
- The old covenant (law) is like a mirror. A mirror shows you your condition, but the mirror does not have the power to change your condition. The law cannot transform us, but the Spirit can!!
- Ezekiel 36:25-27 I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in My statutes and be careful to obey My rules.
- The key to life transformation is receiving a new heart from God and being filled with His Holy Spirit.
- Application #3 Jesus, please transform me! Give me a new heart and fill me with Your Holy Spirit.
